



I am not ashamed of this Good News about Christ. It is God's powerful method of bringing all who believe it to heaven. This message was preached first to the Jews, but now everyone is invited to come to God in this same way. **Romans 1:16** (LB)

1. **I / WE WILL PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL _____.**

- ACTS ENDS WITH _____ FAITHFULLY PROCLAIMING THE GOSPEL.

When we got to Rome, Paul was allowed to live by himself, with a soldier to guard him. ³⁰For two whole years Paul stayed there in his own rented house and welcomed all who came to see him. ³¹He proclaimed the kingdom of God and taught about the Lord Jesus Christ... **Acts 28:16-30, 31a** (NIV)

Day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Messiah. **Acts 5:42** (NIV)

- ACTS BEGINS WITH _____ FAITHFULLY PROCLAIMING THE GOSPEL.

The twelve stood together, Peter shouted to the crowd, Men of Judea and all who are staying here in Jerusalem, listen. I want you to understand... **Acts 2:14** (Voice)

- ...AND IS SATURATED WITH THE _____ PROCLAIMING THE GOSPEL.

That set off a terrific persecution of the church in Jerusalem. The believers were all scattered throughout Judea and Samaria....⁴ Forced to leave home base, the followers of Jesus all became missionaries. Wherever they were scattered, they preached the Message about Jesus. **Acts 8:1, 4** (MP)

But whether I live or die is not important, for I don't esteem my life as indispensable. It's more important for me to fulfill my destiny and to finish the ministry my Lord Jesus has assigned to me, which is to faithfully preach the wonderful news of God's grace. **Acts 20:24** (TPT)

2. **I / WE WILL PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL OF CHRIST _____.**

- THE GOSPEL IS ABOUT _____ FOR ME.

- He died and resurrected to save me.

“Raised” or “resurrected” is used in **24** of the **28** chapters of Acts!

- THE GOSPEL IS ABOUT _____.

“Now everyone in Israel can know for certain that Jesus, whom you crucified, is the one God has made both Lord and the Messiah.” **Acts 2:36** (TPT)

- Jesus is _____, “anointed one” - practically, one sent to deliver/save.

- Jesus is _____, “supreme in authority” or “Controller.”

- THE GOSPEL IS ABOUT WHAT JESUS _____:

So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah!”³⁷ Peter's words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles, “Brothers, what should we do?”³⁸ Peter replied, “Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ...⁴⁰ Peter continued preaching for a long time, strongly urging all his listeners, “Save yourselves from this crooked generation!”⁴¹ Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all. **Acts 2:36-41** (NLT)

- Embracing the true gospel of Jesus is the only way to be saved.

There is no one else who has the power to save us, for there is only one name to whom God has given authority by which we must experience salvation: the name of Jesus. **Acts 4:12** (TPT)

3. **I / WE WILL PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL _____.**

He preached boldly about God's kingdom. No one could keep him from teaching people about the Lord Jesus Christ. **Acts 28:31** (NIV)

Lord, take note of their intimidations intended to silence us. Grant us, Your servants, the courageous confidence...to go ahead and proclaim Your message...³¹ They finished their prayer, and immediately the whole place where they had gathered began to shake. All the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began speaking God's message with courageous confidence. **Acts 4:29, 31** (Voice)

When the Council saw the boldness of Peter and John and could see that they were obviously uneducated non-professionals, they were amazed and realized what being with Jesus had done for them! **Acts 4:13** (TLB)

4. **I / WE WILL PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL _____.**

When we arrived in Rome, Paul was permitted to have his own private lodging, though he was guarded by a soldier. ¹⁷ Three days after Paul's arrival, he called together the local Jewish leaders. He said to them, “Brothers... ²⁰ I asked you to come here today so we could get acquainted and so I could explain to you that I am bound with this chain because I believe that the hope of Israel—the Messiah—has already come. ...²³ So a time was set, and on that day a large number of people came to Paul's lodging. He explained and testified about the Kingdom of God and tried to persuade them about Jesus from the Scriptures. **Acts 28:16, 17, 20, 23** (NLT)

You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you. And you will be My witnesses, first here in Jerusalem, then beyond to Judea and Samaria, and finally to the farthest places on earth. **Acts 1:8** (Voice)
